What have you been up to since graduating from the program?

Upon graduation, I began working for an early stage technology startup in downtown St. Louis. I was hired as the first data analyst. We were focused on providing transparency in consumer packaged goods label data (i.e. the labels on the packaging of the products consumers buy from retailers etc). This transparency comes in the form of transforming complex product label data (e.g. nutrient fact panels, ingredient declarations, marketing claims, allergens etc.) into more consumable attributes such as "Gluten Free", "Organic", "Non-GMO" etc

Our data has many use cases, but is most visible for consumers within common US retail stores. Our data appears online and in stores in the form of various qualifying attributes that provide transparency to the consumer as they consider their purchase options on the shelf, perhaps with a dietary restriction in mind.

After 7 years of working towards our mission, we experienced a successful acquisition exit. Today, I lead our Data Operations department within the company we were acquired by where I continue to focus on our original mission - to bring this level of transparency to consumers on a global scale.

Outside of my profession, my wife and I have 2 children and we live in the Edwardsville area.

I have seen an immense benefit in the critical thinking/problem solving skills I gained via the Philosophy program. These skills have allowed me to craft better arguments in my profession using data to drive my decisions and creativity to solve big problems. Ultimately, completing my Philosophy degree gave me the confidence in life to go out and do hard things.

What part or parts of the SIUE Philosophy Program do you appreciate most?

The willingness of the Philosophy faculty to mentor/help their students was great. This type of access was made possible by the smaller class sizes which led to a more intimate academic environment. This allowed me to build more confidence in my studies and ultimately find success.
