ART EDUCATION - Teacher Licensure (K-12)

Completion of an Associate in Arts or Science degree at Kaskaskia College fulfills SIUE's general education requirements, with the exception of an Interdisciplinary Studies course that all students must take during their junior and senior year at SIUE.

This "Transfer Program Guide" is an **example** of proposed curriculum for students to use while completing their associate's degree. Reading, writing and math placement could alter the course sequencing and transfer date. Therefore students should begin sequencing their reading/writing (if applicable) and math & science courses during the first semester, paying close attention to prerequisites. Students have the option of taking summer classes to lessen fall and spring course loads.

It is highly recommended that students meet with a KC advisor each semester. Please see "Important Student Notes" located on page of two of this transfer guide.

Students are advised to meet on a regular basis with advisors at KC. Courses taken through dual credit can be applied to required SIUE coursework; please contact KC advisor for more information. Please consult Kaskaskia College catalog for additional graduation requirements.

- •Students should begin a file with an SIUE Education Advisor after their first semester at KC by calling the SIUE "School of Education, Health, and Human Behavior" Student Services office at 618-650-3940. Students do not have to be admitted to SIUE before beginning their file.
- •Students are required to complete a Bachelor of Science degree. A Bachelor of Science degree will require completion of 8 courses in life, physical, or social science, in addition to 2 courses with a lab component (some of which will be met with the completion of the Associate in Arts.)
- •Students majoring in Art Education can elect to apply to the Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) degree.

DECLARATION REQUIREMENTS FOR A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE

• An overall GPA of 2.5 in transferable work

ADMISSION TO TEACHER LICENSURE

In order to be admitted into the teacher licensure program, students must:

- Receive a grade of "C" or above in all general education, major content, and professional education courses.
- Complete 30 semester hours of course credit and have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher (this includes work at all institutions attended.)
- Successfully complete EDUC 101 (SIUE CIED 100).
- Students must pass state and licensure tests prior to, during their program, and in order to gain the PEL. State requirements change, so the latest details about this requirements can be found in the SEHHB section of the SIUE Undergraduate Academic Catalog. It is very important that all prospective and current candidates work closely with their advisors to remain current about course and curriculum changes affecting progress through the programs.
